

## Cariñena, Daroca and Belchite



guide for tourism professionals



The South of the province of Zaragoza has hard, extreme and beautiful conditions between oceans of vineyards. The locality of **Muel** conserves Goya paintings in the Nuestra Señora de la Fuente hermitage erected above an ancient Roman dam, but owes its fame to pottery documented since the XVth-century and currently conserved in the **Ceramic Workshop School**, which also houses a modern museum.

In this zone, **Cariñena** is the heart of a territory scarcely populated where life revolves around the fruit of the vine. Its many cellars, some of them with a young and audacious design, together with the Wine Museum are the most appreciated buildings. During the Wine Harvest Festival, at the end of summer, wine flows from its fountains. **Fuendetodos** is the most renowned population thanks to its illustrious son, **Francisco de Goya**. The painter's birthplace and home is conserved and a Printing Museum where part of his stunning graphic work is exhibited.

At the same time workshops and galleries which show work of international prestige have been opened.

Nowadays **Belchite**, one of the most remarked olive oil centres in Aragon is a new village. The old village, a battle scene during the Civil War displays ghostly ruins attracting poets, photographers and filmmakers. Nearby archaeologists have unearthed numerous Celtiberian and Roman remains, such us the **Roman dam in Almonacid de la Cuba** and the **sumptuous Imperial Villa of Azuara**.



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During the Middle Ages, **Daroca** captained an extensive community of villages, its economic and political power facilitated its beauty. Impregnable towers and fortified doors are conserved within the circle of its walls. Romanesque stone and Mudéjar brick work together in its temples and there are noble houses along its undulating streets. This atmosphere intensifies during the Ancient Music Festival each August and Corpus Christi Day, a religious festival inherited from the XIIIth-century.

Nearby we find **Gallocanta Lagoon**, an immense saltwater wetland, a privileged refuge for cranes. Thousands of which arrive from the North and South of Europe during their migration each autumn and the start of spring.

#### **Muel Ceramics**

Pottery is the another of the great Andalusian cultural inheritances. In Muel there is documentation of industrious workshops from the early Middle Ages. The English mercenary, Enrique Cock, under the orders of Felipe II, in 1585, passed through the village and left a written description of its inhabitants, almost all Muslims and their principal labour, pottery. Pieces decorated with blue or golden designs on a white ground predominate amongst the production. The manufacture of ceramics fell into decay after the expulsion of the Moors. It was in the second half of the XXth-century when this artisan activity returned. And today offers the interested quality pottery of varied form and decoration.

# → group offers 1.Goya's Route (1 day) Muel > Cariñena > Fuendetodos > Azuara

Day 1

Ceramic workshop in Muel, Cariñena and wine cellar, Goya's birthplace and the Roman Villa of Azuara.

→ A classic of Zaragozan routes that goes from the N-330 road through the lands which saw the birth of the illustrious Francisco de Goya, amongst a sea of vineyards and colourful Mudéjar art.

→ Muel's ceramics has played a principal role for centuries in local life. In its Workshop school artisan techniques are taught, while recovering the ancient tradition of pottery. The population also has other attractions such us the Virgen of la Fuente hermitage built upon a Roman dam and decorated by the young Goya.

→ Without leaving the N-330, one arrives at **Cariñena**, regulatory centre of the zones' wine. Its wine cellars are its principal reclaim, some of which may be visited, and an interesting wine museum.

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Of further interest are the Church of Asunción, the Town Hall and the Torreta (small tower), as is its prize winning gastronomy and wine harvest festival, with its wine flowing fountains.

 $\rightarrow$  Lunch in a Cariñena P.D.O. wine cellar or in Fuendetodos.

→ In the afternoon a visit to **Fuendetodos**, birthplace of the genius Francisco de Goya. In its well-cared for stone house one finds the family home of the painter and the Print Museum together with an ample show of his work. Before returning the route passes close to **Azuara**, which possesses a large and sumptuous **Roman Villa** with original mythological mosaic scenes – La Malena – (Imperial Era). The imposing Mudéjar church and Romanesque hermitage may also be visited. The return passes through the steppe landscape of Belchite, scattered by salt lagoons, ornithological reserves and wildlife refuge. The place is also well known by olive oil lovers and for its photogenic sunsets.

### 2.Mudéjar Route (1 day) Muel > Longares

Day 1 Daroca, Longares, Zaragoza

→ Departure from Zaragoza via the Mudéjar dual carriageway to Daroca. A walk through **Daroca's historic centre**, a monumental walled city. Inside which we find the Church of Santa María de los Sagrados Corporales Collegiate, San Juan, San Miguel and Santo Domingo, the regional Museum, the Lower and Upper portals and the Manuel Segura Patisserie Museum, a private concern. Traditional Sephardic sweets are sold in the city.

ightarrow Lunch in Daroca.

→ Return via the Mudéjar dual carriageway, stopping off to see the **perfect Múdejar tower in Longares** passing through the entrance arch to the historic centre and visiting the church.
